


Year 9 historians learn about life in the trenches

During their visit, Shukutoku Sugamo students had the opportunity to take part in various lessons. Forty-two Cotswold School students volunteered to be 'buddies', showing our visitors around the school – they did a brilliant job! Over the course of the two days, students worked in groups, looking at the similarities and differences between the UK and Japan, as well as taking part in workshops including: origami, Karuta cards, and traditional Japanese games of Hanaichimonme and Fukuwarai.

It was a delight to host our visitors and we are extremely proud of how The Cotswold School students welcomed and embraced the experience.

A massive thank you to Mr Smith, Ben and Jakob who held an assembly this week to raise awareness of testicular cancer.


