### **Poetry by Heart**

'Poetry by Heart' is a national poetry speaking competition for schools and colleges, open to pupils in Key Stages 2 to 5, and designed to develop confidence with poetry. There were 36,000 entries overall in the competition - Isaac, Theo and Jemimah (Y8) all entered the classic section, whilst Paul (Y8) entered the freestyle. With over 800 entries in the classic competition in Gloucestershire, Jemimah was voted best in county after she memorised and performed 'Daffodils' by William Wordsworth and 'A Short Story of Falling' by Alice Oswald. Well done all!

### The Great Big Live Assembly

On Tuesday, students were involved in 'The Great Big Live Assembly', a live and interactive 20 minute virtual assembly, where students joined a live broadcast, including a live link to a World Vision child-friendly space in a refugee camp in Jordan. Connecting around 500 schools and representing 200,000 children, the assembly celebrated the ways that schools up and down the UK have welcomed new arrivals from war-torn countries around the world into their classrooms and communities.
