Thank you to everyone who responded to the recent annual parent survey, your feedback is much appreciated. We use the results of the survey, as well as the regular feedback we receive, to support future planning of the school. With over 500 responses, we are delighted that 96% of people were happy with the range of extra-curricular activities available, 93% of those who took the survey would recommend us to another parent, 92% were happy with the range of subjects the school offered, and 91% said that their child was happy and does well at The Cotswold School. The results for every question are at least 10% better than the national figures for secondary schools, which we were delighted to see.

Thank you for all your feedback. Please be assured that we are addressing areas upon which we can further improve. We will write to you next term to summarise our actions.










Intermediate Maths challenge

It really is the pinnacle of STEM education. Our younger teams, TCS Army and TCS VEXtreme made incredible strides and finished as the top two comprehensive school teams in the country. TCS Army ended up fifth, which is an incredible achievement given that there are over 300 teams in the UK and that this is their first season. They are more determined than ever to come back next year and become UK champions.
